# Some notes on the Spanish alphabet...

- In English, sometimes vowels take on different pronunciations
- Pronounce the following words:
  - naked, baked
  - water, later
  - roaring, pouring
- In Spanish, 99.99999999% of the time, vowels keep the same pronunciation, making it very easy to pronounce the word if you know how each letter is pronounced
